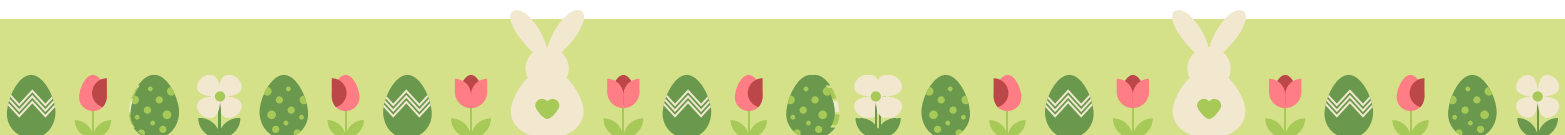
At the last Tuesday Club this term the service users enjoyed designing and decorating Easter bonnets for their upcoming Easter party at Bath Road.
